NARRATIVE

On February 10th, 2025, at approximately 0828 hours, I responded to 9355 104th Court in Vero Beach, Florida. Upon arrival, I met with Heather Wilson, who stated the following: Her father's girlfriend was present inside a green F-150 pickup truck, which I observed parked directly to the north of our location. Heather further explained that her father's girlfriend was attempting to enter the property and was not allowed to be there.

While walking towards the F-150, I noticed a woman outside the truck, later identified as Brooke Allshouse, who appeared to be arguing with the female occupant in the driver's seat. I requested that Brooke walk away, to which she complied. I then made contact with the sole occupant and driver, Stephanie Jean Wheeler. Immediately, I observed a single .22 caliber round on the interior dashboard of the vehicle. Given the unknown status of any potential weapons, I asked Wheeler to exit the vehicle.

Corporal M. Hatton who was present was given notice that Wheeler was possibly a convicted felon and he was aware of the ammunition existing. Corporal Hatton detained Wheeler, and he made contact with the Indian River County Public Safety Dispatch to complete a criminal history check of Wheeler. Corporal Hatton collected Wheeler's maiden name (Stephanie J Orsolits) which was used to complete the criminal history check as well. Before any questioning took place Wheeler admitted to being a convicted felon. I read Miranda warnings to Wheeler which she confirmed understanding. Wheeler claimed that the same round I observed was located in the bed liner of the truck. She moved the round location to where I observed it was inside the truck.

Dispatched provided the following information: Wheeler's current martial name had no convictions. Wheeler's maiden name (Stephanie J Orsolits) had one conviction for possession of methamphetamine in reference to the Haines City Police Department case, Polk County Clerk of Court uniform case number 532022CF00357A000X. I returned to the F-150, retrieving the .22 caliber round and confirming that it was an unspent cartridge.

Given all the above information, I determined that Wheeler was illegally in possession of ammunition. Wheeler was transported to the Indian River County Jail without incident. She violated FSS 790.23.1a, which pertains to the unlawful possession of firearms, ammunition, or electric weapons or devices for felons and delinquents.

NARRATIVE

On Monday, February 10, 2025, at approximately 0927 hours, I responded to the 3300 block of 74th Avenue, Vero Beach, Florida in reference to a suspicious vehicle.

As I arrived, the caller flagged me down and informed me he knew where the vehicle was located. I asked if he could show me and he began leading the way. The complainant stopped his vehicle, we both got out and he began telling me it was down a path hidden from view behind a wooded area. I began walking where the complainant explained. The property was clearly posted as private and warned against trespassing on it. I walked down an unpaved path and noticed a white Nissan Rogue, bearing Florida tag #RFLH52, parked. The engine was on and I could see three occupants inside. The occupants did not initially notice me. I could see the front passenger leaning over the driver's lap, their head was moving up and down over his genitalia. As I stepped closer to the vehicle, the back right passenger noticed me and startled everyone else in the vehicle. I then noticed that the driver had his pants down, his penis was out and erect. The passenger was performing oral sex on the driver. Due to the discovering the illicit act between the two front vehicle passengers, I requested the occupants provide identification. The back seat passenger appeared nervous and kept fidgeting with things in the backseat of the vehicle. I then asked her for her ID, she stated she did not have one. The rear passenger provided the name of Faith E. Johnson with the date of birth of April 19, 1997. I was later able to confirm her identity using her Florida Issued Driver's License. The driver, Richard Mair, provided a Florida issued Identification Card. I asked Richard if he had a driver's license and he stated he did not. Richard advised he did not need a license because he was not driving the vehicle, that he was parked. Richard was in the driver seat, with the vehicle on and in actual physical control of the automobile. The front right passenger/registered owner of the vehicle, identified as Bryan Eugene Pennington. Bryan provided his Florida issued driver's license. Bryan identified himself as "Rachelle" and will be further referred to as Rachelle on this report. Rachelle advised she was a transitioning transgender female.

At this time Deputy David Moore arrived on scene to further assist me. I was then able to provide dispatch with the information provided to identify all individuals involved. During my wait time I began inquiring with the Richard to how they ended up on this property hidden from the road. I confirmed with Richard if he had seen the posted sign and he advised he did. Richard went on to explain "that they weren't doing anything wrong and that they were just getting freaky". As the conversation progressed Richard began getting aggressive and argumentative about our interaction. Due to Richard's unusually aggressive demeanor I asked him to step out of the vehicle so we could have a cordial conversation. I went over to the driver side of the vehicle and I began asking Richard if he had any weapons on his person. I began a weapons pat down and I slide my hand over Richards left front pocket. When I did, I immediately felt a long cylindrical item and a round bulge inside the pocket. I asked Richard what was the item in his pocket and he stated a "lighter". I asked Richard if it would be ok for me to go into his pocket and grab the item. Richard consent and stated it was ok. When I pulled the cylindrical item, I immediately noticed it was a glass pipe, with a burnt tip and burned chore boy inside of it. Due to my training and experience I immediately identified this as paraphernalia commonly used to consume controlled substances. Richard spontaneously uttered something to the effect of "oh that's my crackpipe I forgot it was in there from last night". I then pulled the bulge

like item and it was a pinched off sandwich bag with a green leafy substance inside of it.

I immediately detained Richard in handcuffs and placed him in the back of my patrol vehicle. During our initial contact Richard was very fidgety kept reaching into the different compartments of the vehicle and grabbed a container labeled mentos gum. I asked Faith to step out of the vehicle and escorted her to the back of the vehicle. I then asked Rachelle out of the vehicle. Rachelle did not immediately vacate and noticed she was not wearing pants. Rachelle's genitals were exposed and I asked her to put her clothing back on. As Rachelle gathered herself, I confirmed that she was the vehicle owner and she advised yes. I asked Rachelle if there were any other illicit items inside the vehicle and she stated "Not that I know off". I then asked if she would consent to a vehicle search but Rachelle was very vague in her response. Rachelle advised she "prefer" not to, "that she was not sure what was in there".

Due to the Richards constant reaching, fidgeting and the contraband found previously, I began a search of the driver's side area. During this search I was able to observed several capped used needles inside containers within the reach of Richard and Rachelle. Then expanded my search to the other compartments of the vehicle. Rachelle informed Deputy Moore that she took part in the needles exchange program. A program dedicated to exchanging used needles to keep intravenous drugs users from spreading diseases.

During my search I came upon a red shopping bag, I inquired with Rachelle and Faith on ownership of the bag. Rachelle advised that the items inside the red bag belonged to her. In this red bag that was within her reach, a crystal-like substance, a glass pipe with burned residue on it, a scale and several other needles were discovered. The items were later field tested using a department issued test kit and they test positive for methamphetamine.

As I continued my search to the back of the vehicle, where Faith was sitting, I found a gray backpack. I inquired on the ownership of the backpack, both Faith and Rachelle denied ownership of it. Inside the backpack I found a Ziplock style bag with a green leafy substance inside of it. Inside the same pocket of the suspected Marijuana, I found two baggies with a green powdery substance inside of them. The substance was later field tested using a department issued test kit and it tested positive for Fentanyl.

Upon the discovery of the additional contraband, I detained Rachelle in handcuffs. Deputy Moore and I attempted to detain Faith but she began pulling away from us. Faith pulled away causing us to lose grip on her hands and we were unable to put her in handcuffs. Faith was advised to stop resisting but she continued to stiffen her arms pulling away from us. A brief struggle ensued for the control of Faith's arms and we were finally able to handcuff her.

Once they both were in custody, I continued my search in the front passenger area of the vehicle. In this area, I located a purse that contained several documents and cards with the Rachelle's pre-transition name (Bryan Pennington). Upon further search I found several jeweler's bags with three different pills in each bag. Furthermore, several empty jeweler's bags were located. They matched the bags the pills and the green powdery substance were located in.

Both Faith and Rachelle were escorted out of the wooded area to the roadway where our patrol vehicles were located. I asked Rachelle to sit on the bumper of the patrol vehicle and she did so. Faith continued to resist Deputy Moore and would not allow him to place her in the back of the patrol vehicle. See Deputy Moore's supplement for further details.

I went over to the back of my patrol vehicle, read Richard his Miranda Warnings of Constitutional Rights, he acknowledged understanding them and agreed to speak to me. I inquired about the ownership of the gray backpack. Richard advised not knowing who the backpack belonged to and denied ownership. I then continued asking about the controlled substances inside the vehicle but he denied having any knowledge of them. Richard then advised he was invoking his rights and I stopped any and all questioning on the incident.

I walked over to where Rachelle was sitting, had her walk to my vehicle, read her Miranda Warnings of Constitutional Rights, she acknowledged understanding them and agreed to speak to me. Post Miranda Rachelle advised that the pills were individually packaged in the jeweler's bags for sale and distribution. Rachelle advised that she sells the pills to make money for her everyday expenses. Rachelle advised that she does not have a sole source for the pills and gets them from random people to sell them. Rachelle believed the blue pill was Xanax (Alprazolam), The beige pill to be Generic Alprazolam, and the white pill Adderall. But the pills could not be identified with Drugs.com due to the markings being worn off. The pills are being sent to the lab for further identification. I further inquired about the green powder. I informed her that the substance tested positive for Fentanyl. Rachelle was unaware that the powder was Fentanyl and believed it to be Ecstasy. I asked Rachelle if the green powdery substance was hers and she denied ownership once again. Rachelle advised that she did not consume Fentanyl that she only did "Meth". Rachelle went on to inform that she is on pre-trail release for possession of a controlled substance from another jurisdiction.

Later at the jail, Rachelle reaffirming her understanding of her Miranda Rights advised how the green powdery substance was acquired by her and the two other suspects. Rachelle advised that the three drove up to Vero Beach with the intention to get "Meth". The "dealer" lacking in the quantity they desired offered the Fentanyl to supplement the quantity of Methamphetamine they needed. Rachelle did not elaborate on what their intention was with the Fentanyl.

I could not conduct an interview with Faith due to her chaotic behavior and her active resistance. Deputy Moore had to transport her to the Indian River County Jail for further processing. Richard and Rachelle were transported by me to the Indian River County Jail and turned over to staff for further processing.

Deputy Hoffman arrived a short time after our contact with all occupants of the vehicle. He assisted me in cataloging the contraband, weighing it and field testing the substances. Deputy Hoffman advised that the marijuana had a total packaged weight of 20.7 grams, the crystal-like substance tested positive for Methamphetamine and had a total package weight of 2.1 grams. The green powdery substance tested positive for Fentanyl, it had an individual weight of 6.9 grams and total package weight of 24.8 grams. All substances and paraphernalia were placed into

Rachelle advised that she sells the pills to make money for her everyday expenses. Rachelle advised that she does not have a sole source for the pills and gets them from random people to sell them. Rachelle believed the blue pill was Xanax (Alprazolam), The beige pill to be Generic Alprazolam, and the white pill Adderall. But the pills could not be identified with Drugs.com due to the markings being worn off. The pills are being sent to the lab for further identification. I further inquired about the green powder. I informed her that the substance tested positive for Fentanyl. Rachelle was unaware that the powder was Fentanyl and believed it to be Ecstasy. I asked Rachelle if the green powdery substance was hers and she denied ownership once again. Rachelle advised that she did not consume Fentanyl that she only did "Meth". Rachelle went on to inform that she is on pre-trail release for possession of a controlled substance from another jurisdiction.



NARRATIVE

On February 10, 2025, at approximately 1940 hours, I assisted Detective Castano with searching for a wanted suspect, Jerad Ross, who had an active Indian River County Warrant for Grand Theft Auto.

Deputy Holly and Detective Castano advised they had a visual of Ross at a residence, 3996 47th Place, Vero Beach, Florida. Ross fled westbound, behind several houses. Deputies pursued Ross on foot and caught up to Ross, in the back yard of 4765 40th Avenue, where he was standing in the wood line. Upon making contact with Ross, he began screaming, he had a gun in his hand and continuously reached in his pockets and waistband as though he had a gun. I did not observe Ross holding a gun, but rather, a gray cell phone. Ross was given numerous verbal commands to show his hands and surrender, but he refused to do so. I deployed my taser, causing Ross to go to the ground. Ross immediately continued to state, he had a gun, even after being tased. Ross continuously reached in his waistband of his pants multiple times, presenting as if he was pulling something out. Ross was able to crawl behind a wood fence, where deputies lost visual contact of him. Ross began to flee northwest, through the wooded area, while continuously saying, he had a gun. After Ross fled, a perimeter of the area was established and SWAT was called out to the location.

After several hours of searching for Ross, a drone was able to pick up Ross's location, in the wooded area to the north. Ross again fled from law enforcement, running eastbound towards 40th Avenue, from behind several apartments in Victory Park. Ross was apprehended behind Victory Park Apartments and taken into custody.

Ross was charged with resisting without violence (F.S.S.843.02(3143), violation of probation and his warrant for Grand Theft Auto (WR2025137).

On February 10, 2025, at approximately 1551 hours, I was dispatched to 726 Fleming Street regarding a female who was asked to leave the establishment Infinity Smoke and Vape. The female left the establishment, but according to the caller, she seemed to be impaired. They wanted the Sebastian Police Department to conduct a welfare check on the female. Upon arrival, Seargent Richard and Officer Barton had already made contact with the female, who was later identified as Morgan Clauss. While speaking to Morgan, she was swaying as she spoke. Morgan was searched and placed in the back of my patrol unit and advised that she was being arrested for disorderly In Morgan's bag, there were two Buzz Balls and another oversized can of alcohol. Morgan was also charge with resisting without violence, FSS 843.02. While trying to put her in the patrol car, Morgan purposedly did not want to tuck her feet in, which made Sergeant Richard have to go to the other side of the patrol car to pull her all the way in.
